Growth Mindset

We Can GROW Our Brains! Our brains can grow just like muscles through regular practice.

- Improvement Takes Effort: Just as muscles develop with consistent exercise, our brains get stronger with effort and practice. Learning involves struggles and failures, which help us grow.
- Practice Makes Perfect: The more we practice skills, like reading, the easier it becomes. Our brains recognize patterns and improve over time.
- Focus on Progress, Not Perfection: It's all about making progress. Encourage perseverance: "Just keep going!"
- Embrace Resilience: When challenges arise, remind students to never give up and to bounce back from setbacks.

Educational Glossary: Breaking down buzzwords

Progress Monitoring: Short, timed assessments to measure a student's progress on a skill. They help determine if a child is achieving growth. Students in targeted/intensive interventions are progress monitored weekly.

Interventions: Additional supports to help students succeed.

Tier 2 Interventions (targeted supports): Supports for students who need a little extra help; typically in the classroom. They are often provided in a small group, led by the teacher. We also have staff who may come into the classroom to support more students and provide the help they need early on.

Tier 3 Interventions (intensive supports): Supports for students who need additional assistance. These are more individualized and more intensive and usually take place outside of the classroom.
