Educators and parents are **STRONGER TOGETHER!** Together we can build a powerful **foundation** for a child's **success**, ensuring each child **grows** and **thrives** both **academically** and **personally**.

Power of Positivity!

Encouraging your child to see the good in every situation, to persevere through difficulties, and to celebrate their efforts and successes can make a huge impact on their growth and confidence. Your positive words, support, and encouragement are essential in helping them feel valued and capable.

PeaceBuilder Principle

Praise People: Praising people involves recognizing and acknowledging others' efforts, kindness, and achievements. It's about encouraging positive behavior through affirmation.

Why It Matters: When children learn to praise others, it builds their empathy, encourages teamwork, and fosters a sense of belonging. It also boosts self-esteem for both the giver and receiver of praise.

Model the Behavior: Parents are encouraged to praise their children for efforts, not just achievements. This teaches kids that trying hard and being kind are valued.

Encourage Siblings and Friends to Praise Each Other: Highlight that this principle can be used beyond school, helping to build positive interactions at home and in other social settings.

Join Us in Promoting Praise: Join us in reinforcing this principle, making it a shared effort between school and home.

Growth Mindset and Well-Being

Growth Mindset:

ALL Can Learn! The Power of YET! Instead of saying, "I can't learn," or "I can't get it," we need to encourage students to say, "I haven't learned it YET, but I will keep trying until I get it!"

Well-Being:

We will foster connections with our students and provide them with a sense of Belonging! We will invite ALL to learn and engage in their learning!




Are You Dressed for the Weather?

Recess Recommendations

If the temperature is (actual, feels like, windchill)	You should be wearing	This looks like
0° and below	Indoor recess for all students	
29° and below	Coat Hat Mittens/Gloves Encourage boots and snow pants When there is 1" - 2" of snow, boots are required for the fields and playground, snow pants are required for 3" or more	
30° - 40°	Coat Hat Mittens/Gloves When there is 1" - 2" of snow, boots are required for the fields and playground, snow pants are required for 3" or more	
41° - 49°	Coat, Long Sleeves, Sweatshirt or Jacket	
50° and above	No requirements	


Dear Elementary Families,


